Summary of Responsibilities:

CITs are teen volunteers within our Zoo Crew program. CITs will assist in the ZooCamp experience and help maintain a safe, fun environment for campers (ages 4-10) by encouraging participation, modeling ZooCamp expectations and assisting campers with skills during activities or crafts; CITs will be supervised by ZooCamp staff while working as part of the ZooCamp team, and will gain extensive experience in the organization of camp programs, teamwork, public speaking, and group management.

Essential Position Functions:

1. Enthusiastically greet ZooCampers and their families at the start of each day.
2. Assist campers in finding and using their cubbies and in acclimating to the ZooCamp environment.
3. Encourage campers to participate in morning games and daily camp activities.
4. Model ZooCamp expectations for campers to encourage safe and respectful behavior.
5. Help foster a love of nature and learning in campers through maintaining an enthusiastic, positive attitude.
6. Help create and maintain a safe, welcoming, fun environment for ZooCampers, utilizing tools such as songs and group games when appropriate.
7. Facilitate a variety of Playpod activities for campers during the lunch period.
8. Assist ZooCamp staff in maintaining camper safety while out on Zoo grounds, such as during a tour on when walking to Gate 2 for check-out.
9. Remain with campers and ZooCamp staff during the day.
10. Be present for both AM and PM meetings as well as occasional team building events on evenings or weekends.
11. Help ensure camp runs smoothly and efficiently by assisting with any related tasks, administrative or otherwise, as directed by ZooCamp counselors, Junior Counselors, Assistant ZooCamp Director or ZooCamp Director.

Qualifications:

1. Must be a student in the 7th-12th grade. Age verification may be required.
 - a. Upon turning 18 years old, CITs will age out of the program.
2. Must commit to at least four full weeks of summer ZooCamp, Monday-Friday, 8:00am-4:30pm (5:00pm on Fridays).
3. Must commit to volunteering during either Winter Camp (2/20 - 2/24) or Spring Camp (4/17 – 4/21) as a working interview. If you are unavailable for both Winter and Spring Camp, see "ZooCamp Availability" page for information about a possible third option.
4. Must commit to two mandatory ZooCamp Counselor and CIT meetings on *Monday May 14th, 2018 from 5:30pm – 8:30pm and Sunday June 3rd, 2018 from 1pm – 5:30pm*
5. Arrive on time and stay for the entire shift.
6. Must have reliable transportation to and from the Zoo.
7. Enjoy working with children of all ages.
8. Interest in conservation and the natural world.
9. Ability to work well with others, as well as independently.
10. Effectively support the mission and priorities of Roger Williams Park Zoo.
11. Adhere to all policies described in the Roger Williams Park Zoo's Volunteer Handbook.
12. Must be flexible, positive, enthusiastic, approachable, and willing to learn.

Benefits:

1. Free year-round admission to Roger Williams Park Zoo for yourself.
2. Eight free passes per year to Roger Williams Park Zoo for your friends and family.
3. Good resume builder with potential opportunities for professional development.

- Activity Idea:** *[Your lesson will be more effective if you use activities. Be sure to explain why you have included the activity.]*
- Craft Idea:** *[Include a craft for the campers to do based on the topic, be original!!]*
- Materials Needed:** *[What supplies might you need? For the craft? Activity? To illustrate your point? Other materials?]*
- Background Info:** *[Include at least one page of information on the topic so that other C.I.Ts or counselors could teach your lesson in your absence]*

If selected for the CIT program following the interview process, he/she will be required to assist with four weeks of Summer ZooCamp.

I understand that if my child is accepted as a CIT, he/she will be working with children and zoo staff.

I also understand that if my child is accepted as a CIT, he/she will be offered team building and field trip opportunities outside of the regular ZooCamp day. I allow my child to participate in these opportunities unless otherwise communicated to the ZooCamp Director.

My child has or I will provide reliable and on-time transportation to and from each day of camp. I will also make every effort to not schedule appointments/activities during camp hours. I understand that RWPZ ZooCamp relies heavily on assistance from CITs and their tardiness or absence may affect the quality of zoo campers' experiences.

If my child is selected for a CIT position at Roger Williams Park ZooCamp, I agree to complete a confidential medical information form for my child and to return this form to the ZooCamp Director prior to my child beginning as a CIT.
